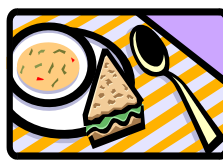
School buses will run at their normal times. Grade 10-12 students arriving early may sit in the 001 Study Hall until 11:30.

PARKING PERMITS

Student parking permits are available for the 2013-14 school year.

Students must have no detentions, no outstanding fees and fines and a valid driver's license to be eligible to apply. Applications may be picked up from the Main Office between 7 a.m. and 3 p.m. or at registration.

Parking permits will be available for pick-up at the registration sessions on August 20, 22 and 27. The \$75 fee and a valid driver's license must be presented when permits are picked up. **Students will be required to return their permit to the Main Office at the end of the school year or students will be assessed a \$10 fine.**

MEDICATION DISPENSING

A signed authorization to dispense medication form must be on file in the Student Services Office if your child requires medication throughout the school day.

Forms are available in Student Services after August 12. A new form must be submitted each school year.



Prescription drugs require **both** parental and physician permission, and non-prescription drugs require parental permission.

Parents are required to bring the medication to the Student Services Office in an original container for dispensation.

ACTIVITY TICKETS/ FAMILY PASSES

Student activity passes and family passes may be used for admittance to music concerts, school plays (excluding musicals) and athletic events (excluding WIAA tournaments). Student activity tickets and family passes may also be used for admittance to East athletic events when East plays at Preble, Southwest and West.

Family activity passes allow admission of parents and children grades K-8. East High students need to purchase individual student activity passes.

Student activity passes and family passes will be available for purchase at the registration sessions on August 20, 22 and 27 and at the ticket gates at sporting events.

Senior Picture Information!

Senior Picture submission guidelines for the East High Yearbook

What is the deadline? The last day to submit senior pictures will be **November 22, 2013**. Pictures cannot be accepted after this date because of printing deadlines from the yearbook company. If no picture is submitted, the student ID picture taken at the beginning of the school year will be used. It is your responsibility to check with your photographer to confirm that a picture was submitted to East High School. A list of names will also be posted in November outside Room 110 for seniors to check whether or not a picture was received.

How can I submit pictures? Pictures can be submitted directly to Mr. Neukirchen, dropped off in the Main Office or e-mailed to jjneukirchen@gbaps.org.

What kind of picture should I submit? The picture should be an upper torso or head shot without any props like sunglasses, hats or objectionable material. The pictures will be printed in color in our yearbook. Pictures may be rejected if they do not follow these guidelines.

Hard copy: Follow the guidelines listed above. Submit in an envelope and/or write your name on the back of the picture. If you want the picture returned, it is up to the student to pick it up. Pictures will be held until the end of the school year.

Digital Copy-preferred: For a nice looking picture, submit a digital picture with the **highest possible resolution!** The best resolution for printing is about 300 dpi or higher. Pictures copied from the Internet or taken with a cell phone do not print very well as the resolution is too low.

Senior Baby Pictures and Tribute Section

The yearbook will again feature a senior tribute/baby picture section. Pictures may be submitted electronically or in hard copy. If scanning a picture, please scan it at 300 dpi. Your student's picture and a tribute of not more than 35-words can be purchased for \$25. Tribute text can be e-mailed to the address below and/or sent along with the picture.

How to Order Your Yearbook

Option 1:

Pay with your school fees in the Main Office at registration. Cost is \$50.00. Make checks payable to East High School.

Option 2:

Go to www.jostens.com. Under the **Yearbook** tab, click, **Buy Your Yearbook**. When prompted, type **East High School** in the school blank and **Green Bay** in the city blank. From there follow the instructions. You can pay with PayPal or credit card and order extras like name embossing and other options.

NWTC Health Programs

There is only a five-day window, Monday, September 9, through Friday, September 13, for the following programs:

Students are encouraged to hand deliver their completed application, transcript, ACT/ Accuplacer scores, and application fee directly to NWTC starting on Monday, September 9. Transcripts can be requested from Student Services. These programs are very popular and competitive.

9TH GRADE CONFERENCES

East High Counselors will be conducting Freshman Conferences with all 9th grade students and their parents/guardians. These conferences, which all freshmen and their parents/guardians will be invited to attend, will focus on your child's strengths, talents and interests, his/her educational and career development, and information to begin planning for his/her future. Our goal is to work with you to develop a plan and motivate your student in order to ensure his/her success in high school. Conferences generally last 30-45 minutes.

Topics covered will include the development of a 4-year plan, extra/co-curricular activities, service learning, and post-secondary thoughts and ideas.

Please contact the Student Services Department at 448-2092 or come during registration days in August to set up an appointment with your son/daughter's counselor. Conferences will begin in mid-September and hope to be concluded by mid-November.

College-Bound Seniors

Most four-year colleges and universities begin accepting applications September 15. There are some exceptions, so be sure to check with your college website. Stop in Student Services or the Career Center for an up-to-date list of available scholarships starting in September.
