


ACHIEVEMENT










GROWTH

This priority area measures year-to-year student progress on statewide tests. It uses a value-added model that seeks to control for circumstances beyond the influence of educators. A high value-added score means that on average students in the school are progressing more quickly than other, similar students. Priority Area Score








TARGET GROUP OUTCOMES

Priority Area Score










